Title of the notified document: Draft Commission Implementing Regulation amending Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2072 as regards the listing of pests and rules on the introduction into, and movement within, the Union territory of plants, plant products and other objects. Language(s): English. Number of pages: 38
6.	Description of content: Implementing Regulation 2019/2072 contains the list of Union quarantine pests, protected zone quarantine pests and regulated non-quarantine pests (RNQPs). Furthermore, it lays down phytosanitary import and internal movement requirements for plants, plant products and other objects that may pose a phytosanitary risk to the European Union. The draft amendment of Implementing Regulation 2019/2072 stipulates: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Addition of new pests in the list of Union quarantine pests (<i>Agrilus bilineatus</i> (Weber), <i>Gymnandrosoma aurantianum</i> Lima and <i>Naupactus xanthographus</i> (Germar));• Removal of certain <i>Tephritidae</i> species from the list of Union quarantine pests;• Deletions and revisions of the Protection Zones for <i>Erwinia amylovora</i> (Burrill) Winslow et al.;• Addition of new import and internal movement requirements;• Revision of existing import and internal movement requirements; Addition/Revision in CN codes.
