Description of content: The DA Administrative Circular No. 9, series of 2025, Guidelines on the Bilateral Recognition on Regionalization of High Pathogenicity Avian Influenza (HPAI) from Accredited Countries for Export of Live Birds (Poultry and Non-Poultry), its Products and By-Products, provides guidance for applicant countries to implement zoning or regionalization.

This circular, like the one for ASF, is a major shift from a country-wide import ban to a science-based regionalization approach.

7. Objective and rationale: **food safety**, **animal health**, **plant protection**, **protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease**, **protect territory from other damage from pests**.
