Prior to this amendment third countries were only allowed to import into the Union poultry meat from poultry that have been kept in that third country since hatching or imported from another third country under conditions at least equivalent to the conditions for imports into the Union; the amendment of the Harmonised System (HS) Customs code for egg products to be indicated on the import certificate.
