Description of content: This regulation specified the maximum level requirement of preservatives as food additive in processed food.</p> <p>The name of food additives allowed to be used as preservatives are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Sorbic acid and its salts;2. Benzoid acid and its salts;3. Ethyl para-hydroxybenzoate;4. Methyl para-hydroxybenzoate;5. Sulphites;6. Nisin;7. Nitrites;8. Nitrates;9. Propionic acid and its salts;10. Lysozyme hydrochloride. <p>The maximum level requirement of preservatives in each food category is listed in Annex 1 as an integral part of this regulation.</p> <p>The content of preservatives in processed food must be proved by a certificate of analysis.</p> <p>The type and use of preservatives other than those listed in Annex 1 should only be used after obtaining approval from the Head of NADFC.</p> <p>Preservatives and processed food containing preservatives which have a marketing approval must adhere to this regulation no later than one year from the date of enactment.</p> <p>Preservatives and processed food containing preservatives which were submitted prior this regulation will be processed based on the Regulation of the Minister of Health No. 722/Menkes/Per/IX/1988 on Food Additives as amended by the Regulation of the Minister of Health No. 1168/Menkes/Per/X/1999. The validity period of this marketing approval will be one year.</p>
