Title of the notified document: Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2018/490 of 21 March 2018 repealing Decision 2007/365/EC on emergency measures to prevent the introduction into and the spread within the Community of Rhynchophorus ferrugineus (Olivier). Language(s): English, French, Spanish. Number of pages: 1 6. **Description of content:** Repeal of the emergency measures concerning the prevention of the introduction and the spread of Rhynchophorus ferrugineus in the EU territory. Specific requirement were introduced with Directive (EU) 2017/1279 to ensure the protection of Ireland, United Kingdom and Azores (Portugal), defined as protected zones for this pest. Furthermore, Rhynchophorus ferrugineus has also been listed by Directive (EU) 2018/484 as a regulated non quarantine pest for the EU territory in order to ensure that propagating material of Palmae, which is marketed within the Union is free from the pest. 7.
