- **6. Description of content:** The amendment to the Regulations Relating to the Application of the Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point System (HACCP System), R908 of 2003 makes provision for mandatory application of a HACCP System by the food handling enterprises listed in Annex B.
- Objective and rationale: [X] food safety, [] animal health, [] plant protection,
  [] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [] protect territory from other damage from pests.
- 8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: Due to the fact that ready to eat (RTE) processed meat products were the source of the Listeriosis outbreak, the Director General of Health recommended on the basis of food safety and the health of the consumers, that the food handling enterprises be listed to implement a mandatory Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point System (HACCP System). The Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Act (Act 54/1972), makes provision for a regulation/amendment to be published without a comment period if it is in the interest of public health.
