Description of content: The objective of the notified document PMRL2018-54 is to consult on the listed maximum residue limits (MRLs) for fluazifop-butyl that have been proposed by Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA). <u>MRL (ppm)¹ Raw Agricultural Commodity (RAC) and/or Processed Commodity</u> 5.0 Leaf lettuce 3.0 Head lettuce 1.5 Green onions (crop subgroup 3-07B) 0.5 Bulb onions (crop subgroup 3-07A, except dry bulb onions) ² 0.08 Caneberries (crop subgroup 13-07A) ¹ ppm = parts per million ² Dry bulb onions are excluded from this MRL action as a 0.5 ppm MRL is already established for the commodity.
