6.	Description of content: <i>Araucaria</i> schedule was amended to include conditions for <i>Xylella fastidiosa</i> , which only applies to <i>Broussonetia</i> genus. Other host plant genera (<i>Hakea</i> , <i>Sassafras</i> , <i>Stewartia</i> , <i>Swainsona</i> , and <i>Talinum</i>) laid under conditions of <i>Hebe</i> schedule, which has already appropriate measures against <i>Xylella fastidiosa</i> on plants for planting pathways.

Among the new hosts, there are six new host plants that are not appropriately managed under the current Import Health Standard 155.02.06: Importation of Nursery Stock (the IHS). New host plants are: <i>Broussonetia</i> , <i>Hakea</i> , <i>Sassafras</i> , <i>Stewartia</i> , <i>Swainsona</i> , and <i>Talinum</i> .
