- **6. Description of content:** The Order bans the importation of processed porcine/pork meal for animal fee use and immediately suspends the issuance of Sanitary/Phytosanitary Import Clearance (SPS-IC) for the said commodities. All shipments of the aforementioned goods into the country will be confiscated by Department of Agriculture (DA) Veterinary Quarantine Officers/Inspectors at all major ports.
- 7. Objective and rationale: [] food safety, [X] animal health, [] plant protection, [] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [] protect territory from other damage from pests.
- 8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: The DA has issued several memoranda banning the importation of domestic and wild pigs and its products from ASF-infected countries. Evidence supports consumption of contaminated feed is a possible transmission route of ASF virus to domestic pigs, and there is a need to prevent the entry of ASF virus into the Philippines through animal feeds of porcine origin to protect the health of the local swine population.
