- 6. **Description of content:** This is an urgent amendment to include the species *Solanum melongena* to effectively manage the risk of PSTVd on this import pathway. The import health standard describes import specifications and entry conditions for seeds for sowing imported into New Zealand.
- 7. Objective and rationale: [] food safety, [] animal health, [X] plant protection, [] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [] protect territory from other damage from pests.
- 8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: Emergency measures are being adopted to prevent the introduction into New Zealand of the regulated pest *Potato spindle tuber viroid* (PSTVd) which may be associated with imported *Solanum melongena* seeds for sowing. This decision is based on recent interceptions of PSTVd on *S. melongena* seeds for sowing imported into New Zealand from two different countries of origin.

MPI's measures to manage PSTVd on this pathway are a change to the import specification for *Solanum melongena* seeds for sowing. The *Solanum* schedule in Import Health Standard 155.02.05: Seeds for sowing which has measures in place for PSTVd has been urgently amended to include the species *Solanum melongena* to effectively manage the risk of PSTVd on this import pathway. The measures require a phytosanitary certificate with additional declarations for either a Pest Free Area, or Pest Free Place of Production or that the seeds have been officially tested and found free from PSTVd. Testing of seed for PSTVd may be conducted prior to export or on arrival in New Zealand.
