Members formulate MRLs in accordance with the good practice in use of veterinary drugs (GPVD), which is applicable to their

	<p>respective conditions. Since the pathogenic bacterium and environmental factors are vary in different producing regions and members, they may choose different ways of veterinary drugs using. Therefore, Chinese MRLs for veterinary drugs in foods may differ from Codex standards.</p>
