5.	Title of the notified document: The CFIA is prohibiting the import of <i>Salpichroa</i> spp. from all origins except the continental United States. D-08-04: Plant Protection Import Requirements for Plants and Plant Parts for Planting. Language(s): English and French. Number of pages: 48 and 53
6.	Description of content: The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) will prohibit the import of all propagative plant material (excluding seeds) of <i>Salpichroa</i> spp. from all origins except the continental United States. <i>Salpichroa</i> spp. is a host of the tomato leaf miner (<i>Tuta absoluta</i>), a regulated pest of Canada. In order to further prevent the spread of <i>Tuta absoluta</i> into Canada the CFIA will add <i>Salpichroa</i> spp. to Appendix 2: Plant taxa that are Not Authorized Pending a Pest Risk Analysis (NAPPRA) when intended for planting of D-08-04: Plant Protection Import Requirements for Plants and Plant Parts for Planting. The CFIA and the United States Department of Agriculture - Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA-APHIS) continue to work together by aligning our efforts to prevent the introduction of <i>Tuta absoluta</i> . CFIA's Automated Import Reference System (AIRS) is the definitive source for up to date import requirements.
