Description of content: The New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries is publicly consulting on the following proposed amendments to the Import Health Standard (IHS): <i>Seeds for Sowing</i> (155.02.05): <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Removing measures for <i>Broad bean mottle virus</i>, <i>Cowpea severe mosaic virus</i>, <i>Pea early-browning virus</i> and <i>Peanut mottle virus</i> from the requirements for <i>Phaseolus</i> seed for sowing;- Removing measures for <i>Peanut mottle virus</i> and <i>Peanut stunt virus</i> from the requirements for <i>Pisum</i> seeds for sowing.
