As a result, Australia is updating its import conditions for dogs from approved countries. The Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry is removing the requirement for dogs to test negative for <i>E. canis</i> prior to importation into Australia, consistent with Australia's international trading obligations.		
		ges to the import conditions will take effect from 1 November 2022. Affected import ts will be varied, and all permit holders will be notified of the changes directly.
