| 6. Description of content: Mefenftrifluconazole is an approved active substance in GB. An application was received by the Health and Safety Executive to set new MRLs for apples, pears, apricots, cherries, peaches, plums, table grapes, wine grapes, sunflower seeds, rapeseeds, sugar beet roots and products of animal origin. Following assessment, new or raised MRLs have been introduced to accommodate new authorisations of plant protection products in GB and to set Import Tolerances. The Evaluation Report and Reasoned Opinion supporting the new or raised MRLs is available at the following link.
