6.	Description of content: The Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) is proposing to add three new regulated pests to the import requirements for <i>Vitis</i> plants for planting. The viruses are <i>Grapevine fabavirus</i> , <i>Grapevine leafroll-associated virus 2 "red globe"</i> and <i>Grapevine virus E</i> . MPI proposes regulation of all three of these viruses with PCR during post-entry quarantine. These measures will be required post-border in New Zealand and will not affect trade. MPI is also proposing to remove the option to import <i>Vitis</i> cuttings or plants <i>in vitro</i> sourced from open-field mother plants when being imported from an approved offshore facility. This will not affect trade, as there are no approved facilities currently. This amendment brings the nursery stock import health standard in line with the MPI Offshore Facilities Standard.
