6. Description of content:

Retained Regulation 2019/1793 sets rules concerning the temporary increase of official controls applicable to certain food and feed of non-animal origin entering Great Britain from the countries listed in that Regulation. This is due to the risk of contamination by aflatoxins, pesticide residues, dyes, preservatives, pentachlorophenol and dioxins by microbiological contamination.

The proposed changes listed below have been subject to an assessment of the risks, by the FSA and FSS, and are science and evidence based.

It is proposed that the notified document (the Regulation) amends Annexes [1](#), and [2](#) to Retained Regulation 2019/1793 by introducing the following changes:

Annex 1

- New listing of CN Codes for Groundnuts Paste (Food and feed) from Bolivia in Annex I.
- Groundnuts in shell, Groundnuts shelled, Peanut Butter, Groundnuts, otherwise prepared or preserved, Oilcake and other solid residues, whether or not ground or in the form of pellets, resulting from the extraction of Groundnut Oil and Groundnut Flours and Meals (Food and feed) from Brazil listed in Annex I for Aflatoxins to be delisted.
- New listing of CN Codes for Groundnuts Paste (Food and feed) from Brazil in Annex I.
- New listing of CN Codes for Groundnuts Paste (Food and feed) from China in Annex I.
- Decrease from 20% to 10% frequency of identity and physical checks to be performed on Sweet Peppers (*Capsicum Annuum*) (Food – crushed or ground) from China for Salmonella.
- New listing in Annex I for Granadilla and Passion Fruit (Food) from Colombia at 10% frequency for identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- New listing in Annex I for Bananas (Food - fresh and dried) from Ecuador at 5% frequency for identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- New listing in Annex I for Oranges (Food – fresh or dried) from Egypt at 10% frequency of identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- Decrease from 50% to 20% frequency of identity and physical checks to be performed on Palm Oil (Food) from Ghana for Sudan Dyes.
- New listing in Annex I for Drumsticks (*Moringa Oleifera*) (Food fresh, chilled or frozen) from India at 20% frequency of identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- New listing in Annex I for Rice (Food) from India at 5% frequency of identity and physical checks for Aflatoxins and Ochratoxin A, and Pesticides.
- New listing in Annex I for Cinnamon and Cinnamon-Tree Flowers (Food – dried spices) from India at 10% frequency of identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- New listing in Annex I for Cloves (whole fruit, cloves and stems) (Food – dried spices) from India at 10% frequency of identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- New listing in Annex I for Nutmeg, Mace and Cardamoms (Food – dried spices) from India at 10% frequency of identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- New listing in Annex I for Seeds of Anise, Badian, Fennel, Coriander, Cumin or Caraway, Juniper Berries (Food – dried spices) from India at 10% frequency of identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- New listing in Annex I for Ginger, Saffron, Turmeric (*Curcuma*), Thyme, Bay Leaves, Curry and other spices (Food – dried spices) from India at 10% frequency of identity and physical checks for Pesticide Residues.
- New listing in Annex I for Melon Seeds (Food) from Iran at 10% frequency of identity and physical checks for Aflatoxins.

- Hazelnuts (Corylus sp.) in shell, Hazelnuts (Corylus sp.) shelled, Mixtures of nuts or dried fruits containing hazelnuts, Hazelnut paste, Hazelnuts otherwise prepared or preserved including mixtures, Flour Meal and Powder of Hazelnuts and Hazelnut Oil (Food) from Türkiye in Annex 1 for Aflatoxins to be delisted.
