- **5. Title of the notified document:** Emergency amendments to Import Health Standard 155.02.06: Importation of Nursery Stock. **Language(s):** English. **Number of pages:** 371
- **6. Description of content:** This standard describes the import specifications and entry conditions for nursery stock (whole plants, cuttings, bulbs and tissue culture) imported into New Zealand.
- 7. Objective and rationale: [] food safety, [] animal health, [X] plant protection, [] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [] protect territory from other damage from pests.
- 8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: Cucumber green mottle mosaic virus and Tomato brown rugose fruit virus are tobamoviruses that would cause significant impacts to New Zealand if an incursion occurred. Species of Portulaca are asymptomatic hosts of Cucumber green mottle mosaic virus, and species of Malva and Portulaca are asymptomatic hosts of Tomato brown rugose fruit viruses. The viruses are spread through water, mechanical transmission, and soil. Both viruses are regulated pests in New Zealand, and there are measures on Cucurbitaceae seeds for Cucumber green mottle mosaic virus, and on tomato and capsicum seeds for Tomato brown rugose fruit virus. The need to amend the import health standard for asymptomatic nursery stock hosts was identified but previously deemed non-urgent as the import pathways were not active. However, the pathway status has changed and thus the IHS requires urgent updating to facilitate safe trade. The Import Health Standard 155.02.06: Importation of Nursery Stock (IHS) was urgently amended to include measures for the management of Cucumber green mottle mosaic

virus on Portulaca species eligible for import to New Zealand, and for the management of Tomato brown rugose fruit virus on Malva and Portulaca species eligible for import.
