If no, describe, whenever possible, how and why it deviates from the international standard: There is no CXL for azoxystrobin in/on rhubarbs.

The GB MRL being adopted for azoxystrobin in/on celeries is higher than the CXL. This is to accommodate an authorisation that gives rise to higher residues in celeries than permitted by the CXL and which our assessment demonstrated to be safe for UK consumers.
