(head lettuces including crisphead and "Iceberg" type lettuces), <i>Lactuca sativa</i> L. var. <i>longifolia</i> Lam. (cos or romaine lettuces), <i>Lactuca sativa</i> L. var. <i>crispa</i> L. (leaf lettuces), crosses of these varieties, curled-leaved endives of varieties (cultivars) grown from <i>Cichorium endivia</i> L. var. <i>crispa</i> Lam and broad-leaved (Batavian) endives (escaroles) of varieties (cultivars) grown from <i>Cichorium endivia</i> L. var. <i>latifolium</i> Lam to be supplied fresh to the consumer.</p> <p>This standard does not apply to produce for industrial processing.</p>
