6. Description of content: The proposed standard will replace the three current standards (*Cut Flowers and Foliage*, *Cut Flowers and Branches Cordyline and Dracaena Species from All Countries*, and *Oncidium Cut Flowers*).

We are proposing several key changes to what can be imported, and to our import requirements.

- Adding 36 new plant genera and remove 78 plant genera. This would bring the total genera available to import to 136;
- Cut flowers and foliage will be available from 26 countries instead of 14;
- There will be additional requirements to manage pests on 57 host genera;
- We will no longer require any cut flowers and foliage to be devitalised.
