Description of content: The New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) is proposing the following changes to the Importation of Nursery Stock import health standard: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Addition of <i>X. fastidiosa</i> to the quarantine pest list of 27 new plant host species/genera;• Removal of <i>X. fastidiosa</i> from the quarantine pest list of 10 plant genera;• Amendment of current measures for the management of <i>X. fastidiosa</i> in sections 2.2.1.12 and 2.2.5 of the standard, for plant hosts imported from countries considered not to be free from <i>X. fastidiosa</i> by MPI (and for plants <i>in vitro</i> where the country of origin is different to the parent plants);• Amendment to current measures for the management of <i>X. fastidiosa</i> in sections 2.2.1.12 and 2.2.5 of the standard, for plant hosts imported from countries considered to be free from <i>X. fastidiosa</i> by MPI (and for plants <i>in vitro</i> where the country of origin is the same as the parent plants, which is free from the bacterium).
